Introduction

THANK YOU for purchasing a John Deere product.

READ THIS MANUAL carefully to learn how to operate and service your vehicle correctly. Failure to do so could result in personal injury or equipment damage. This manual and safety signs on your machine may also be available in other languages. (See your John Deere dealer to order).

THIS MANUAL SHOULD BE CONSIDERED a permanent part of your vehicle and should remain with the vehicle when you sell it.

MEASUREMENTS in this manual are given in both metric and customary U.S. unit equivalents. Use only correct replacement parts and fasteners. Metric and inch fasteners may require a specific metric or inch wrench.

RIGHT-HAND AND LEFT-HAND sides are determined by facing in the direction of the machine or implement will travel when going forward.

WRITE PRODUCT IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS (P.I.N.) in the Specification or Identification Numbers section. Accurately record all the numbers to help in tracing the vehicle should it be stolen. Your dealer also needs these numbers when you order parts. File the identification numbers in a secure place off the vehicle.

WARRANTY is provided as part of John Deere's support program for customers who operate and maintain their equipment as described in this manual. The warranty is explained on the warranty certificate which you should have received from your dealer. All warranties are covered in the WARRANTY Section 130 in this manual.

CLEANING AND POLISHING PLASTIC HOOD AND FENDERS

IMPORTANT: To keep scratches on plastic parts to minimum, do not rub or brush off any parts with bare hands, use a soft cloth (i.e. cheesecloth) or a light flow of compressed air. For dirt, wash with steady stream of water only (no detergent), then blow off excess water with air.

1. Remove excess dust or dirt.
2. When surface is dry, spray on PLEDGE® and leave for 30 to 60 seconds.
3. Using a dry soft cloth (i.e. cheesecloth) wipe off to bring up lustre.

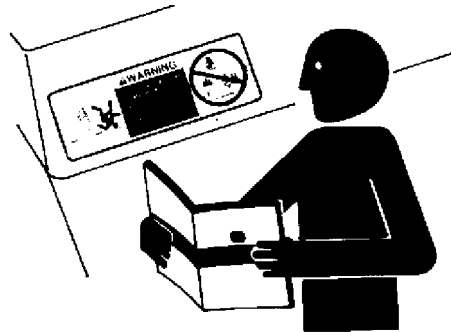

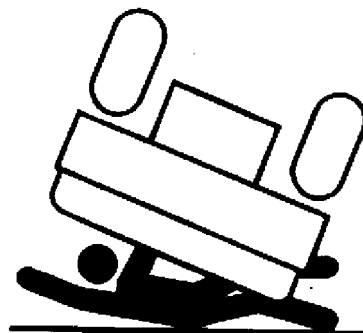

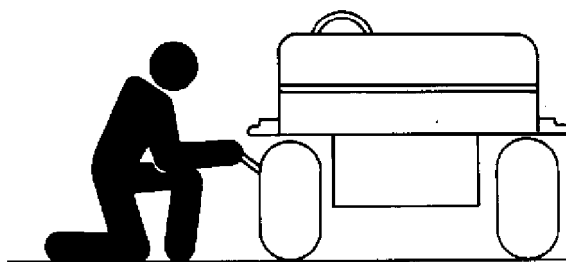


INSPECT UTILITY VEHICLE

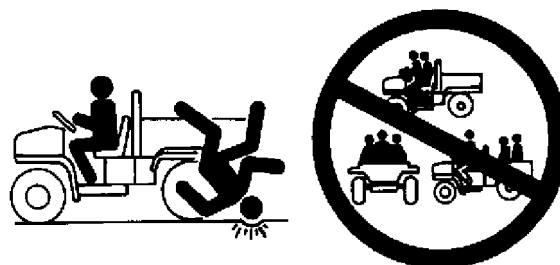
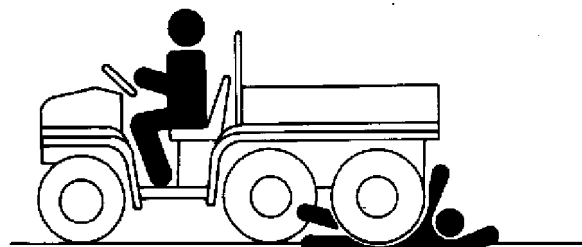

OPERATE UTILITY VEHICLE SAFELY

View the videotape provided with the vehicle for safe operating practices.

DO NOT misuse the GATOR™, it is a utility vehicle NOT a recreation vehicle.

To provide adequate braking ability and traction, DO NOT tow any attachment or loaded trailer unless utility vehicle cargo box is loaded.

Horseplay and recreational riding can lead to accidents, severe bodily injury or death.

Sit on the center of the seat and keep both feet within the foot platform perimeter.

Always use both hands for steering.

Use existing trails. Avoid terrain where you do not belong, such as dangerous slopes, impassable swamps and low hanging branches.

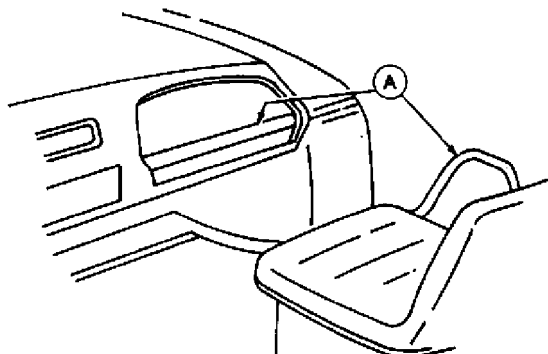
Before dismounting:

USE HAND HOLDS

Hand holds (A) are provided for passenger balance when driving over rough terrain. Use both dash bar and side rails on seats for stability.

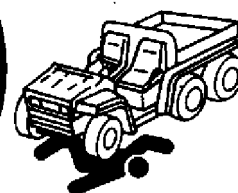

PREVENT VEHICLE RUNAWAY

Avoid possible injury or death from vehicle runaway.

Do not start engine by shorting across starter terminals. Machine will start in gear if normal circuitry is by-passed.

NEVER start engine while standing on ground. Start engine only from operator's seat, with transaxle in neutral, with park brake engaged.

INFLATE TIRES PROPERLY

Keep all tires inflated to 34—41 kPa (5—6 psi).

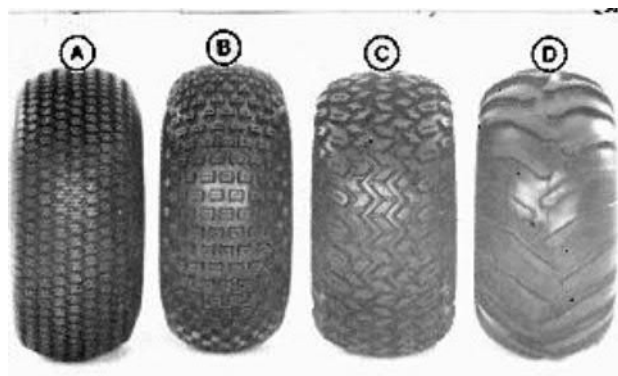
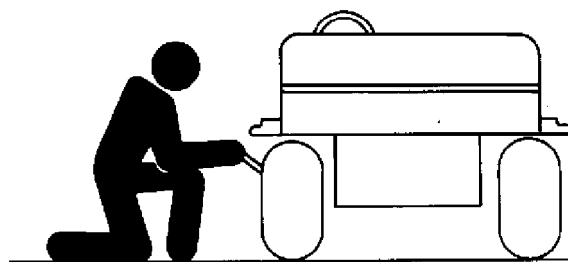
Heavy-Duty All Purpose tire inflation pressure can be as low as 27 kPa (4 psi) to provide a better ride.

Improper tire inflation can affect stability and control of vehicle.

DO NOT mix sizes and/or tread types of tires. Use of John Deere approved original or optional equipment is recommended. Turf, Bar, Knobby and Heavy-Duty All Purpose tires are available.

Order replacement or optional tires from your John Deere dealer.

AVOID TIPPING

Accidents resulting in serious injury or death can occur from tipping the GATOR. Observe the following practices to help prevent tipover accidents:

Do not engage in horseplay. The GATOR is not designed for recreational riding.

Do not allow drivers younger than 16 years old, and never allow riders in cargo box.

Drive very slowly when turning. Sharp turns could cause the utility vehicle to roll over even at slower speeds or on flat ground.

Reduce speed and exercise extreme caution on slopes or on rough ground.

Do not overload vehicle and avoid shifting loads. Reduce load when operating over rough or hilly terrain.

Do not stop or start suddenly when going uphill or downhill. Be especially cautious when changing direction on slopes.

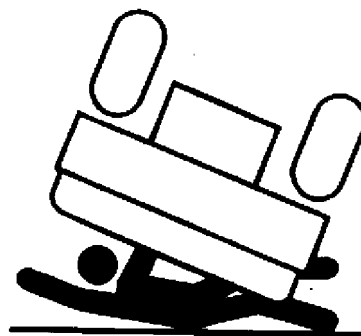
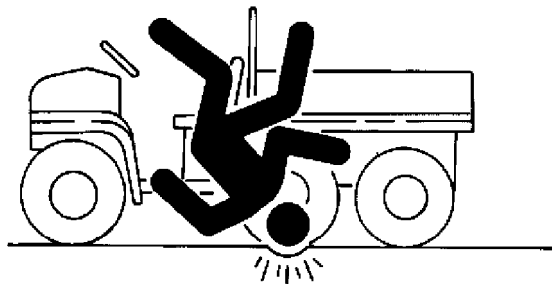
Stay alert for holes, rocks, and roots in the terrain, and other hidden hazards. Keep away from drop-offs.

Keep front wheels straight at crest of hill or going over bumps.

When descending a hill, remove foot from accelerator and apply brakes to reduce speed and maintain control.

Do not make changes or modifications to the GATOR.

Use of a helmet and/or protective gear is recommended for certain operating conditions.

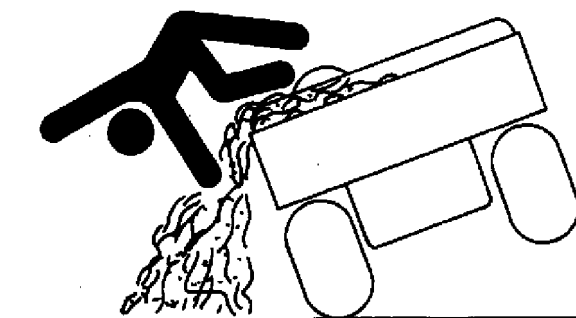
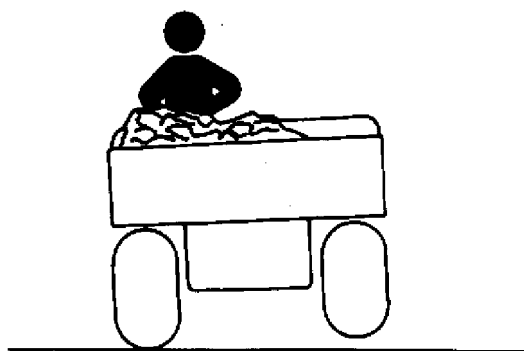
TRANSPORT LOADS SAFELY

Use care when towing loads:

- Use only approved hitch point and hitches.
- Do not tow loads that exceed 544kg (1200 lb) with the 6X4 or 408kg (900 lb) with the 4X2. Tongue weight on hitch should not exceed 45kg (100 lb).

When carrying loads:

- Be sure load guard is properly installed.
 - Be sure load is evenly distributed.
 - Do not load above load guard.
- On level terrain, do not exceed maximum box payload capacity of 363 kg (800 lb) for 6X4 or 227 kg (500 lb.) for 4X2.
- Reduce box payload when operating on rough or hilly terrain.
- Securely anchor all loads.

SERVICE COOLING SYSTEM SAFELY 6 X 4 ONLY

Explosive release of fluids from pressurized cooling system can cause serious burns.

Shut off engine. Only remove filler cap when cool enough to touch with bare hands. Slowly loosen cap to first stop to relieve pressure before removing completely.



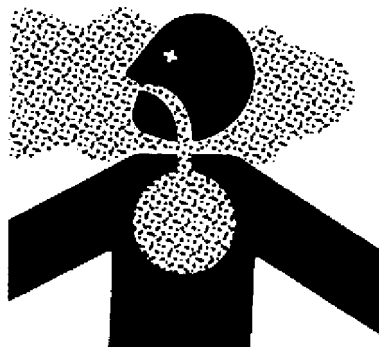

WORK IN VENTILATED AREA

Engine exhaust fumes can cause sickness or death. If it is necessary to run an engine in an enclosed area, remove the exhaust fumes from the area with an exhaust pipe extension.

If you do not have an exhaust pipe extension, open the doors and get outside air into the area.

DISPOSE OF WASTE PROPERLY

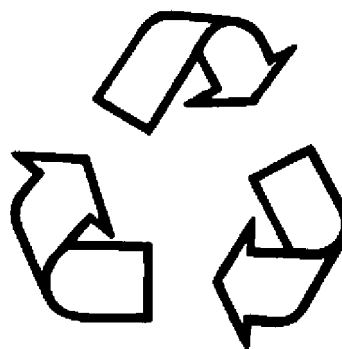
Improperly disposing of waste can threaten the environment and ecology. Potentially harmful waste used with John Deere equipment include such items as oil, fuel, coolant, brake fluid, filters, and batteries.

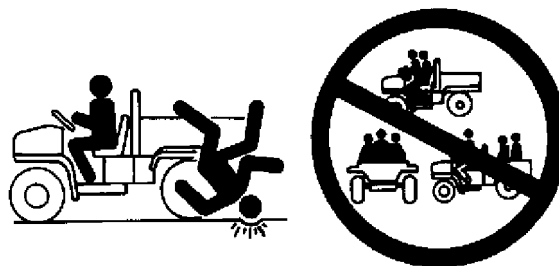


KEEP RIDERS OFF VEHICLE

Seating is provided for operator and one passenger. No riders are allowed in cargo box or anywhere else on vehicle.

Riders on vehicle are subject to injury such as being struck by foreign objects or being thrown off of the vehicle and severely injured or killed.

Riders affect the operators *ability to control the vehicle as well as its* center of gravity. Also, riders could obstruct the operator's view resulting in the vehicle being operated in an unsafe manner.

HANDLE FUEL SAFELY—AVOID FIRES

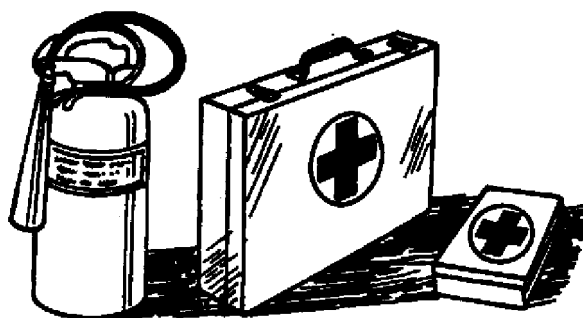

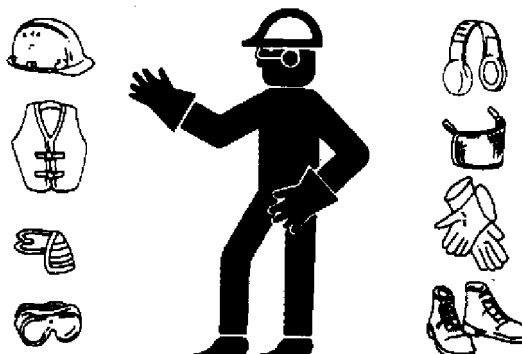
WEAR PROTECTIVE CLOTHING

Operating equipment safely requires the full attention of the operator. Do not wear radio or music headphones while operating machine.



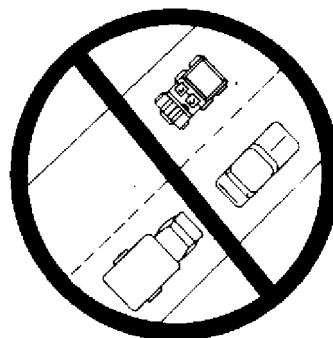

HAUL UTILITY VEHICLE SAFELY

To help prevent the possibility of fire from ignition of gasoline or vapour, turn fuel shut off valve "OFF" before transporting vehicle.

Turn fuel shut off valve (A) to "OFF" position (arrow down) during transport.

This will help prevent fuel from being drawn up into air filter and/or carburetor from air movement and motion from travel.

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Do not tow utility vehicle behind any other vehicle.

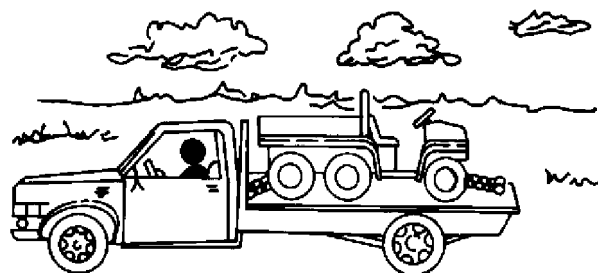
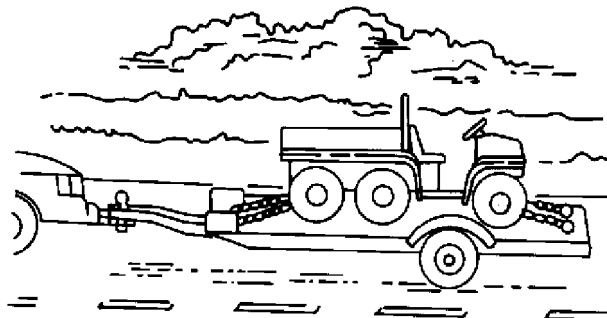
Use a heavy-duty trailer, full size pick-up or truck to haul your utility vehicle.

NOTE: Pick-up shown is a full-size Ford, space limitations may vary with other makes. Short bed trucks do not have the length requirement for vehicle.

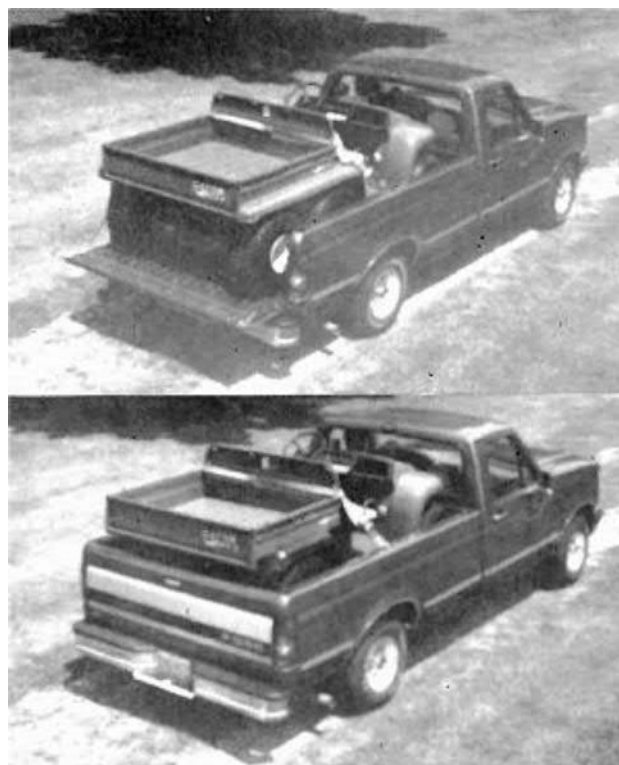
Lock park brake.
